

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# **About us**

Sadler's Wells is a world-leading creative organisation, dedicated to presenting, producing and touring dance made today in all its forms. Sadler's Wells commissions, presents, and produces more dance than any other theatre in the world – from tango to hip hop, ballet to flamenco, Bollywood to cutting-edge contemporary dance. With an innovative, year-round programme of performances and learning activities, this is the place where artists come together to create dance, and where we welcome everyone to experience dance and be inspired.

Our aim is to reflect and respond to the world through dance: enabling artists of all backgrounds to create dance that moves us and opens our minds; sharing those experiences with the widest possible audiences to enrich their lives and deepen their understanding of what it means to be human.

More than half a million people come to our theatres in London each year, with many more enjoying our touring productions at partner venues across the UK and in cities around the world. Sadler's Wells Theatre has been located in Islington since the 17th century. Today Sadler's Wells consists of the Sadler's Wells Theatre (1,500 seats); the Lilian Baylis Studio (180 seats); three rehearsal studios; bars, a café, facilities for private and corporate entertaining and offices for Sadler's Wells' colleagues.

Our second theatre building and West End home, the Peacock (1,000 seats), is subject to a unique agreement whereby Sadler's Wells and the London School of Economics jointly manage it, with the LSE presenting its lectures to students during the day and Sadler's Wells presenting theatre at night.

#### **Future Plans**

Our fourth venue Sadler's Wells East will open in 2024 in east London's Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park. Sadler's Wells' new space will be located on the Stratford Waterfront site, opposite the London Aquatics Centre, alongside UAL's London College of Fashion and the V&A Museum. The site will form part of a new cultural and education district, which will also include a major new University College London (UCL) campus and have direct links to the creative communities already based in east London.

Sadler's Wells' new space will house a 550-seat mid-scale theatre, as well as facilities for a choreographic centre and a hip-hop theatre academy, all planned to open in 2024 as well as facilities for the Rose Choreographic School and Academy Breakin' Convention.

### **Artistic Programme**

The artistic programme encompasses not only productions and presentations but also all our artist development, learning and participation and touring programmes. The vision is led by the Artistic Director and Chief Executive through the Artistic Programming Board which includes the Executive Producer, Associate Artistic Director, Artistic Programmer and Artist Development, Director of Learning and Engagement and Director of Breakin' Convention.

### Learning & Engagement/Breakin' Convention/Producing & Touring at Sadler's Wells

Our current learning and participation work reaches 20,000 annually and seeks to provides life enriching experiences through dance for people of all ages. The department aims to increase

access to the artistic programme at Sadler's Wells and supports, celebrates, and showcases the creativity of all the participants who engage in its activities.

# **The Department**

The role reports into the Marketing and Communications Department and works on marketing and PR content and works for the Digital Stage & Content Department on video outputs and occasionally for other departments such as Development and Learning & Engagement. We are dedicated to making and sharing an inspiring programme of digital content and seamless online experiences and that enable global access to and engagement with dance and Sadler's Wells.

The Digital team supports artists and colleagues to make and share world-class digital experiences for audiences and participants. The core of our activity is focused on managing and maintaining the Sadler's Wells website, supporting the creation and distribution of digital content, and leading on in-house film making and video editing for our digital channels. The Digital & Web Team is headed by the Senior Digital Manager, and comprises the Video & Digital Specialist, Videography Assistant, and the Digital & Content Coordinator.



## The Role

This role is due to commence in March or April 2024.

The Junior Videographer role is responsible for:

- Filmmaking and editing of video content for marketing campaigns, ensuring high quality and consistency of video assets for Sadlers Wells digital channels.
- Running small scale shoots and editing video content for key organisational projects to help achieve the mission and vision of Sadler's Wells.
- A part of this role will also include producing impactful trailers using pre-provided footage from dance companies, often with a short turnaround.

You will be a core member of the Digital and Content Teams dedicated to producing and delivering digital content and experiences that inspire, inform, and engage people globally through dance.

The Junior Videographer reports to the Video & Digital Specialist.

# What are my responsibilities?

### **Videography**

- Support the mission & vision of Sadler's Wells by creating compelling video content that drives global awareness and participation in dance experiences.
- Shoot & edit highly engaging marketing video content (e.g., audience reaction 'vox pops') to assist in the promotion of visiting shows and work responsively to marketing needs.
- Edit, brand & upload promotional marketing videos that showcase our artistic programme, ensuring high quality and consistency across all assets for Sadler's Wells digital channels.
- Set up professional camera, audio & lighting equipment for film shoots to ensure high quality video production for inhouse content creation.
- Assist Video & Digital Specialist with technical support and set-up of spaces during film shoots to enable delivery of large-scale in-house video productions.
- Use After Effects to create and animate graphical content for promotional trailers, front of house screens & general marketing activities to help engage new audiences with the in-house programme and digital stage.
- Assist with the creation, production, and distribution of video content to support organisational projects and ensure success of core communication objectives.

- Create marketing and organisational content for Sadler's Wells in-house signage system so that visitors to the theatre are given accurate and relevant information.
- Resize & compress video content for different social media & digital platforms, so we can provide tailored content for each channel.
- Assisting with maintenance of video camera equipment, ensuring hardware is properly handled for safe and effective use during shoots.
- Assisting with maintenance of the video archive for all past Sadler's Wells shows and video projects, including the labelling and filing of all raw footage.
- Use efficient media management processes for effective organisation of Sadler's Wells video projects, particularly for large scale season announcements to ensure safe and comprehensive archival and that folder structures are easy to navigate.
- Subtitle content to meet our commitment to increasing accessibility on our digital platforms.
- Support with researching best practice in video production, accessibility, and social media trends to support our goals for continual improvement and growth in video creation.
- Create video presentations for internal and external communication (e.g., Artist/Artistic Director/Chief Executive talks) that illustrate the important work that we both create and support in the dance sector.

### **Administrative**

- Follow Sadler's Wells video production guidelines to assist with administration of organisational video projects to optimise success and ensure smooth delivery of projects.
- Conduct administrative work generated by the above activities.

#### **General**

- To cover for the Video & Digital Specialist where necessary
- To assist other departments with their video needs e.g., converting, compressing, transferring
- Work flexibly according to project demands and crunch points during the year to ensure effective scheduling of half-time hours.
- Live, breathe and role model our organisational values of Excellence, Collaboration, Inclusion, and Innovation, being aware of the influence and impact you can have in Sadler's Wells
- Attend occasional staff meetings, training sessions and other events which may take place outside normal working hours
- Undertake other duties as may be reasonably required

- Thrive working collaboratively with internal and external filmmakers, content producers and project managers.
- Efficient time management, ensuring project timelines are realistic, and deadlines for content are met.
- Experience in uploading to and managing video content on platforms such as YouTube or Vimeo
- A good working knowledge of Instagram, Facebook, Twitter, and YouTube
- Competent in Microsoft Office
- An understanding of digital accessibility
- Able to work with a high degree of accuracy.
- Initiative-taking, able to work with minimum supervision and a desire to develop new skills.
- Able to meet tight deadlines and work on multiple projects simultaneously.
- Must currently hold the right to work in the United Kingdom
